

Enjoy the rest of the year! Steve


NOTE FROM THE EDITOR







1994 Meeting of C.V.O.A. BOARD OF DIRECTORS Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

Meeting was called to order on Friday, July 29th, 1994 at 8:18 p.m. by C.V.O.A. President Steve Mayefske.

Introduction of Regional Directors: Dan McNally (Region 3, Host), Chris Northington (Reg. 2), Fred Kieffer (Reg. 4 & 5), John Cowall (Reg. 8), Bob Chin, (Reg. 10), Jim Stallwitz (Reg. 11), and Tim Morgan, (Reg. 12)

Treasurer's Report: Paul Wicker distributed fiscal reports of July '92 thru July '93 and current report July '93 thru July '94 along with record of merchandise sales from May '93 thru June '94 from Mike Rupert.

Membership Report: Paul Wicker distributed membership reports by region. For July 1994 with July 1993 for comparison. We have 259 registered mailings, including 220 active/paid members. This is down 15% from last year, but approximately the same as in 1992. This club is **not** growing.

Financial Analysis: Paul Wicker summarized that 62% of revenue comes from membership dues. The other 38% comes from advertisers in the newsletter and merchandise sales. Total revenue is up \$300 from last year.

Old Business: None brought up.

New Business: Paul Wicker recommends that we change our corporate status from profit-taking corporation to non-profit organization. This would avoid payment of income taxes, cut down on tax preparation, and simplify annual reporting. He will contact an associate at work who will assist him in handling this legal documentation instead of the commercial firm which currently does these things.

Merchandise Report: Mike Rupert advises that the C.V.O.A. has 105 complete reproduction stripe kits available for sale, with some "opened" kits available for individual items. Mike reports that we have 100 pairs of square-background "Cosworth Twin Cam" fender decals additionally available. He suggests an expediate dispersal of these decals because the top layer of protective plastic is often difficult to remove and can lead to decal damage without careful installation. He notes that aging of these decals will exaggerate this trouble. Former Reg. 1 Director, Dan Chieppa makes a proposal to distribute a pair to each Round-Up attendee. Seconded by John Cowall. All Directors concur. Mike will give pair to all who ask for thm at the Round-Up with the remaining inventory to be sold for only \$5.00 per pair after the Round-Up. All

Mufflers: Paul Wicker reported the proposed BORLA muffler purchase program is not dead; but notes that their muffler is shorter and noisier than stock. Note: '75 has 21/4" inlet; '76 has 2" inlet. Brad Stone reports that he has a source who will custombend a complete stock system in stainless steel. Paul Wicker has N.O.S. '76 muffler(s)

available. Michael Price (RMP) will offer '75 or '76 remanufactured systems through his business.

Fuel Filters: Duke Williams has contacted Bendix regarding purchase of new stock fuel filters. They advise we can obtain them for \$50 each if we can get a commitment for 50 units. These will be newly manufactured, but identical to original equipment. With insufficient interest, Duke will see if Bendix will reproduce only 35 units. Members mentioned that units for '82 Corvette or '85 Cadillacs will bolt in but appear different than O.E.M. Cosworth filter. Sixteen attendees showed interest at \$50 price. Order is needed by the end of summer. Paul Wicker will take \$50 deposits, but not cash checks without sufficient orders for minimum buy. The seven directors present agree to commit \$500 of C.V.O.A. funds to buy ten units for merchandise sale at \$5.00 mark-up.

Pulse-Air Tubes: Re-Production was discussed. Consensus was that it would be expensive with limited interest. Mention was made that existing units can be repaired in various methods.

Dash Bezels: Bill Hutton is exploring units made in two pieces from Trans-AM stock. **Desired Products:** carpeting, horn buttons, one-piece dash bezels.

Much discussion was made of getting Cosworth's emission-certified and/or legal in various states. All states do not have the same requirements. John Cowall will send information from C.O.V.A. (Council of Vehicle Associations) to Mike Rupert for coordination of putting their efforts into the newsletter.

Cosworth Calendar: Someone inquired about desirability of the members for a calendar with pictures of different Cosworths for each month.

Harriet Marr suggested that we send letters to all former members to invite them to next year's Round-Up in Detroit, which will celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the Cosworth Vega coming on sale. Further suggestions that a postcard would be fine.

Tim Morgan will give 15% discount to club if we will provide him with the club membership list. He will then advertise parts in Hemmings from his business, M.A.R.R.S. Members on the list get 15% off, non-members pay in full. This would encourage non-members to join. Motion was made by Rupert to accept his proposal. Jim Stallwitz seconded. All directors approved.

Paul Wicker recommended raising C.O.V.A. dues to \$30 per year or \$75 for three year membership. It was seconded by Mike Rupert. Stipulation was made that new dues will become effective on January 1, 1995 and one and three year memberships can be paid at the old rates (\$25/yr. or \$60/3 yrs.) until that date. 

GM ANTIFREEZE TECH BULLETIN

GM Technical Bulletin #436201, February 1994, reviews the specification for antifreeze and specifically recommends that propylene glycol based products (Sierra Brand) not be used. The bulletin discusses viscosity, heat capacity, boiling and freezing points, and specifically debunks the "environmentally safe" marketing hype that usually accompanies these products. The bottom line is use high quality ethylene glycol based products mixed 50/50 with water (potable or distilled) and change at least every two years (the shop manual recommends every year) regardless of low mileage. Antifreeze doesn't wear out, but the corrosion inhibitor additives will be consumed over time even if the car is parked or has low mileage accumulation. Corrosion has been known to erode the top of the cylinder bores at the head gasket interface. This condition may not be repairable and you may need to replace the engine block. The Cosworth Vegas total cooling system capacity is about eight quarts empty. One quart of high quality ethylene glycol based antifreeze for about five bucks every two years is cheap insurance against a major failure!
