

CVOA H-Body Regional Director Open Position

Hello All,

I am sending this to see if you have any interest in fulfilling the Roles and Responsibilities of the H-Body Regional Director Position for the CVOA. Jack Hovick has requested to step down from the position.

I think there is great potential for the CVOA in regards to H-Body Membership and Participation with the CVOA. This was shown this year at the TN National Roundup. Having 8 non Cosworths participants is huge. And, after hosting a few CVOA Regional Roundups at the Detroit, MI Woodward Dream Cruise, I see a few other non Cosworth H-Body participants as well. It is just a matter of creating a cohesive message to relay to these Owners who may be seeking a larger community to be active with. And that is where the H-Body Regional Director can be a great asset for those Owners, being a point person for them to contact.

Unfortunately, the CVOA does not have a good way to trace who exactly is a "H-Body Owner". So, the "Region" name is more of a concept, than actual physical region. The position of H-Body Regional Director is best fulfilled by being both a ProActive and a Reactive Person. I will define that out a little more in the Basics of the Position below.

Here are some basics of the Position

- 1) Being a Dues paying Member of the CVOA. This a key component. All Staff of the CVOA are Dues paying Members. So, to fulfill the role, you need to be an active Member
- 2) ProActive Roles, some of roles require a Regional Director to be ProActive. Reaching out on your own, contacting potential Members. Spreading the Word of the benefits of the CVOA and highlighting how the CVOA can enhance a H-Body Owner's ownership.
- -Some ways to do this is
- Identifying potential new members. Contacting them, whether through email, phone, social media posts etc.
- Letting Potential members know how the CVOA can help. There is a lot of experience in the CVOA. Technical support, local CVOA members to the potential member to get in contact with, meet up, help with advice on getting a car back on the road, if there are issues. Many Cosworth Owners have owned other H-Bodies in their

time, and can be of real assistance.

-Letting potential members know their are Regional or National Meets happening in their area. This could be quite simply reaching out to the Facebook Groups and announcing the Events are happening

-This is NOT a recruitment role. The CVOA is not about "We need so many members, etc." It is about educating and being a lifeline for Cosworth Vegas and H-Bodies to provide help, guidance, and support when a Member needs it. All that is asked of the H-body Regional Director Role in this regard is to let potential Members know the Club is there when someone needs us

3) Reactive Roles. This is best described as when someone reaches out to you. Has questions.

-You do not need to be an Authority on All things H-Body. (It helps to know quite a bit, but you do not need it to fulfill the role) You just need to know how and where to direct someone when a question comes up. You will not know all of the answers! That is why you are Point Person. They reach out to you, you help them find the person who can best answer their questions. This is mainly a technical support type of answer help for a potential member.

-Another way to be reactive is when a potoential member reaches out and wants to meet up with other Members. Then, you put them in contact with local owners near them. Using the CVOA Member Search function is a phenomenal tool for this. Getting Owners together helps keep all owners active.

4) Being a Director for the CVOA

-This part of the director role is pretty easy. You stay in contact with other Regional Directors. Emails, facebook, Instagram, whatever. You are a factor as a leader of the CVOA. You could write a yearly article for the CVOA Magazine. Or a quarterly article. (Writing articles doesn't have to be extravagant! It can literally be a 3 sentence, I met up with so and so. We had lunch at .. And we chatted about my latest project. and then 1 or 2 photos of that meet up!)

-Or, you just answer questions when asked!

Medium Saddle Metallic CVs By the Numbers

Medium Saddle Metallic CVs "By the Numbers" (Body Paint Code 67)

Medium Saddle Metallic CVs are believed to be the 2nd rarest color in the CV world. According to the CVOA Registry, we have been able to track 23 CVs in the Medium Saddle Metallic exterior color. It is believed that approximately 600-650 Cosworth Vegas were produced in a color other than Black, in the 1976 year. According to the CVOA Registry, we have tracked approximately 440 total colored CVs. We have tracked a total of 2544 CVs, which is 72.5% of all CVs produced. (yes, there may be a couple discrepancies in all of the Registry, but, by and large, the Registry is pretty accurate). By these numbers, approx. 32 CVs are believed to have been produced in this Medium Saddle Metallic Color.

Here is a break down of Saddle CVs by Interior colors. (as Currently Documented with the CVOA Registry)

Black Vinyl - 1

Black Cloth - 0

Buckskin Vinyl - 17

Buckskin Cloth – 4

Unidentified - 1

The first known Medium Saddle Metallic CV according to the records and Registry of the CVOA is #2664. #2664 current status is unknown, it is believed to have been owned by Maurice Schecter. a long time CVOA Member. back in the early 80's. The last CV ever produced was a Medium Saddle Metallic color, CV #3522. #3522 is still alive, and was last at a CVOA National Roundup back in 2006, the Canton, OH Roundup. Most Medium Saddle Metallic CVs were used and used up in regards to still being around today. As of right now, we know of 4 that are for sure RIP, with another 4 that would take extensive work to bring back to life, basically parts cars. That's a third of the total numbers we have on these cars! We have 7 Medium Saddle Metallic cars that are currently listed as "uknown" meaning we do not know who the current owner is or where the car is based on the Registry. So, needless to say, this color CV is a rare bird to see out in the wild!

So, lets explore a few examples of known Medium Saddle Metallic CVs...

CV #3204 Currently owned by Bryan Pridmore of Murietta, CA.

Bryan Picked the car up about 3 years or so ago, and has been slowly getting her back roadworthy. The car spend many years in a storage unit in CA!.

Bryan recently got the engine back running, after solving a power draw issue that was driving him crazy!

The car is a 5 speed, and is originally tan vinyl interior. A previous owner had dark brown cloth seat inserts put on the front and rear seats. Obviously for the comfort in the Southern Los Angeles, CA heat!

Hope to hear Bryan keeps this one running for a long time!



Medium Saddle Mettalic CVs By the Numbers Cont.

CV #3177 Currently owned by Chris Fetter from Baltimore, MD.

Chris picked up CV #3177 about 6-7 years ago, and put the car through a restoration. He brought the car to the 2024 CVOA National Roundup in Cookeville, TN.

#3177 has a storied past. The car was owned by Ron Miller back in the 80's. He had a multiport Nitrous Oxide Kit installed on the car. Ron Miller brought the car to the CVOA National Roundup in 1989 and showed off the car. Many in the CV world were blown away by the car. It is the only known CV To have NOS installed on it! The stories of the performance of the car and drag racing new Porsches in its day are legendary!

Chris Fetter has chosen to restore the car back to the way Ron Miller had it. (With a few custom touches of his own!) It is a beautiful car, and Chris raved about the car's performance!







CV #3522 Current Owner Rodney Farmer in Peninsula, OH

CV #3522 is not only the last CV in Medium Saddle Metallic produced, it is the very last CV ever produced. This car has spent its entire life the Midwest. The car has not always had the best taken care of her. She currently needs some radiator core support repair, as of last reporting according to the Registry and records of the CVOA. This car was last seen by the CVOA at large at the 2006 CVOA Roundup in Canton, OH. Interesting note, this was the only time CV #0001 and CV #3522 were ever at the same event at the same time! The first and the last CVs! Hopefully Rodney will keep CV #3522 up and running, a true piece of CV History, being the last ever!

Lane's Museum, Cooter's Garage, Heritage Gold Judging, Etc.

The Lane is famous for housing the largest collection of European automotive items in the United States. The collection also features many micro cars and some very unique aircraft inspired automotive pieces including a propeller driven "car" which was demonstrated in operation by a museum staff member. Needless to say most of the collection is items you normally don't see at your standard local car show and likely not at all. Most of the collection requires one to read the signage to even have a clue of what many of them are. The collection also includes some flying machines that hang from the ceiling so there are things to see in nearly every direction. The museum is housed in a building that once was a bread factory that has been converted to its current use. Like many museums the Lane has as many or more items in storage than are on display which is kind of hard to imagine, but a look in the windows of the lower level proved that to be true.

The Willie Nelson museum is exactly what you would expect and documents his extraordinary career and is

Gas Tank Program Update



Here is where we stand on the OEM Gas Tank Re-pop Program.

Tanks Inc. is the company who making these re-pop tanks for the CVOA. They are based in Monticello, IA, their phone number is 319-465-3522. Here is some information about them. "For over 30 years we have offered a variety of polyethylene, stainless steel, mild steel and alloy coated steel gas tanks for street rods, muscle cars & classic trucks. We also specialize converting your vehicle to fuel injection. If you are ready to make the jump to EFI for your hot rod or pro touring car we probably have a solution for you. Gas tanks and fuel pumps are not all that we offer, we also have fuel senders and tank accessories to complete your project." Taken from their Website, www.tanksinc.com.

As of right now our gas tanks are getting stamped out. We made great head ways on getting these things reproduced. We should feel very fortunate having these tanks It was not an easy battle to get this done. It took multiple attempts then they told me they would get back

with me. Well, a couple months went by and I got a surprising email from them. They said they would consider stamping out some Cosworth Vega tanks. The catch was they only wanted to stamp out one stamping of these tanks. The tank they had in mind was what they call a EFI tank that takes a drop in fuel pump for the V8 guys. Basically, the top half of the tank has a different stamping from the OEM tank.

It was important for us if they were going to stamp out tanks to be able to stamp out a tank that would work with our OEM fuel pump, sending unit, and with the tray in the bottom of the tank for the fuel injection. A couple weeks went by and we came to an agreement they would do two stampings on these tanks, a OEM tank for the Cosworth Vega and a EFI tank for a drop-in fuel pump. To make this program work we would need to come up with 50 prepaid orders in a 3-month span with half the money up front then the other half after completion.

A few days before the deadline we were falling short on the 50 prepaid orders. I put so much time and effort in this program and we were struggling to get 50 prepaid orders. If it wasn't for the CVOA stepping up by picking up the slack and ordering the extra needed tanks to get us to 50 prepaid orders this program would have been dead. And, more than likely, it would not come back around getting gas tanks made for our cars. I want to personally thank everyone that participated in this program. I feel like this will be a one-time run on these tanks as it will take another minimum order to get any

more stamped out. Tanks Inc. plans on stamping out a few extra tanks 10? over the order they have but no plans on stocking these tanks in hopes they sell the surplus of stock.

If you're thinking about getting a tank I would act quickly and contact Tanks Inc to place an order while they are stamping them out. The CVOA is buying a few tanks for the Stock in the CVOA Parts program, but that will be a limited quantity, once they sell out, they are gone!

As far as when you can expect a tank. Expect around the beginning of April maybe slightly earlier. We struggled to get 50 prepaid orders but once the word got out this is a real deal and it was going to happen we managed to get 100 plus orders. It's going to take a little time to stamp that many tanks out. The tanks are being produced overseas. Then box them up and get them billed and shipped out will take some time too. I appreciate everybody's patience on this as I know it has been a long road.

In the meantime I've been working with Clyde Biagi on getting gas tank installation kits made for our tanks. He's been making them for the Monza tanks for a while so making them for the Cosworth Vega tank wasn't too big of a deal for him. He puts together a nice kit that I highly recommend you get when installing these tanks.

The kit includes 4 insulators 2 of them go on the bottom for the straps and the other 2 sit on top of the tank so the tank does not rub on the body. Also comes with a 4" vapor hose a 4" low pressure fuel return hose and a 4" EFI high pressure feed hose along with the rubber fuel hose plus all clamps. He's also including the two bolts and nuts that secure the straps to the car. He's asking \$74.95 for the kit \$10 shipping. In October, the first test sample tank from Tanks Inc was sent to me to test fit. There were a few issues, and I let Justin know at Tanks Inc exactly what was wrong. The tray inside the tank was off by a few inches, so the float was hitting the edge. That needed to be reposi-

tioned. Alos, one of the corners and one of the edges was not bent down enough to clear the body and the exhaust correctly. I took pictures, used colored to tape to highlight the outside area issues, and sent that on to Justin at Tanks Inc to correct it.

I got a email from Justin in November at Tanks Inc. ,He got a new sample tank stamped out for me with the improvements I asked for. The original first stamped tank I got actually fit okay I was just concerned about a couple areas being a little tighter than I liked didn't want anybody to have any issues with fit on their particular car. He had those areas bent down more for clearance. He also has the tray repositioned where it won't interfere with the float. We were off 1" 7/8 so we should be good there now.


Got the second tank mount in the car and we're making good headways on clearance issues. Actually the tank fits perfect just concerned about one more area that other people may have an issue with. The left front corner flange I had tanks bend it down as much as they could and it did help but I still don't like that corner. To me it sticks out too far and some people might have an issue with it touching the muffler. It fits ok on two of my cars but I like to see more clearance between that flange and muffler. What Tanks is going to do for me they're going to cut that point off that corner.

So, we have a go on the Sample Tank, and the re-pop program is a Go!
